Message from the President

We are delighted to welcome 270 new Diplomates as Board-Certified Surgeons and congratulate them all on this milestone in their professional careers.

The ABOMS Board has been hard at work on several initiatives over the past few months. Most notably, we continue to work with ACGME and CODA to explore dual accreditation for our specialty. At the present time ACGME has convened a task force to specifically examine the pathway forward. We look forward to continuing to work with both groups to facilitate this in the future. To address the issue of unmatched residency positions, this year the ABOMS Board elected to support dental students interested in OMS by providing vouchers to cover the expense of CBSE preparation. We received an overwhelmingly positive response with many applications received from eligible dental students.

Additionally, we are modernizing the Certificates of Added Qualifications programs in Oral/Head and Neck Oncologic and Reconstructive Surgery and Cleft and Craniomaxillofacial Surgery to represent a recognition of a subspecialty area of practice. In April, we underwent a Strategic Planning process with input from our Diplomates, past and current examiners, and several key stakeholders including AAOMS and ADA to inform and align the Board's strategic priorities for our future. We are working on the final stages of our strategic plan which will be made available to our Diplomates in the near future.

It will depend on leaders who are willing to contribute their expertise, engage in thoughtful discourse, and make difficult decisions for the betterment of the profession and the protection of the public. Thank you for your commitment to our patients, to our specialty, and to one another.

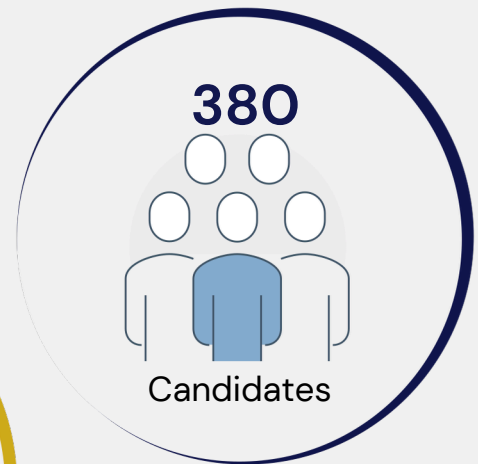

Diplomates Making a Difference

Dr. Jeffrey Brooks

*Advancing OMS Through Service, Mentorship,
and Compassion*



Dr. Jeffrey Brooks is a private-practice oral and maxillofacial surgeon located in Western Michigan. His interest in the specialty began in dental school after witnessing a patient's transformative outcome following orthognathic surgery. He was drawn to the specialty for its unique integration of complex human anatomy, an area he previously taught as a college anatomy tutor, and the opportunity to make a meaningful impact on patients' lives. That sense of purpose has remained a defining theme throughout his career, leading to his nomination for Diplomates Making a Difference by a patient whose experience left a profound impact.

Dr. Brooks' multi-office practice serves the Western Michigan community, including the underserved population, a commitment he attributes to the generous and service-oriented culture of his group practice.



"My partners and I donate a significant amount of care to the low-income dental clinics in town and to the uninsured population. We work in emergencies on an almost daily basis. If the patient is in pain, we do our best to get them in as soon as possible."

In addition to providing full-year oral surgery coverage at the local Level 2 Trauma Center alongside his fellow partners, Dr. Brooks is also invested in shaping the future of dentistry.

His practice hosts dozens of pre dental students and dental assisting students throughout the year, enabling them to complete their observational requirements while providing experience in the field.

Through his clinical service, community commitment, and mentorship, Dr. Brooks continues to make a meaningful impact on both his patients and the broader field of oral and maxillofacial surgery.



Diplomates Making a Difference

Dr. Timothy Nguyen

Practicing OMS at Sea Aboard the USS Gerald R. Ford

Dr. Timothy Nguyen, a newly certified ABOMS Diplomate, recently completed an 11-month deployment aboard the *USS Gerald R. Ford*, where he provided care for more than 4,500 warfighters.

As the sole oral and maxillofacial surgeon aboard the ship, he provided full-scope OMS care six days a week, performing procedures such as third molar extractions, implants, and dentoalveolar surgery. In addition to routine surgical care, he maintained constant readiness to manage facial trauma and airway emergencies in the deployed environment.

Dr. Nguyen relied heavily on his comprehensive OMS training which enabled him to contribute beyond dental care including performing an emergent intubation during an acute respiratory deterioration in an injured sailor. Experiences such as these reinforced the importance of preparedness in an ever-changing deployed environment.

Although deployment can be physically, mentally, and emotionally demanding, Dr. Nguyen found the opportunity for surgical independence particularly rewarding. As the only OMS provider aboard the *USS Gerald R. Ford*, he was able to apply years of rigorous training while caring for patients in a uniquely challenging environment.

"I've gained a deep appreciation for both versatility and preparation. I've been fortunate to train under outstanding mentors whose guidance continues to shape my approach to complex and unpredictable cases. Practicing in the middle of the ocean aboard the world's largest and most advanced aircraft carrier, while traveling globally, has made the experience uniquely formative."

In his next assignment, Dr. Nguyen will serve in Okinawa where he will practice both clinic and hospital-based oral and maxillofacial surgery. Looking ahead, he hopes to return to Austin, Texas and bring his unique experiences and skills gained during his military service to private practice.
