




What is the Qualifying Examination?

- Also known as the QE
- Computer-based examination at Pearson VUE centers
- 300 questions covering 10 domains
- First-step in becoming Board certified


When can I apply?

- Completed training at an accredited OMS program or alternative pathway given by ABOMS
- Opens in June
- All submissions must be done electronically on the ABOMS website

| Pathology | 31 |
| Reconstruction | 21 |
| Implants | 30 |



What is the Oral Certifying Examination?


- Second-step in coming Board certified
- Apply once you've passed the QE
- Oral based examination
- Administered in February
- Three surgery sections consisting of four 12-minute cases

A photocopy of current dental licensure

Upload a photo to your ABOMS profile
